<u>Proposed re-instatement of Community Speed Watch (CSW)</u> in Malmesbury.

Introduction.

Back in the early noughties Malmesbury was one of the first towns to introduce a volunteer CSW. The equipment was kept in the Town Hall and was signed out and in at the end of the shift. The volunteers (normally three), decided on the road they are going to monitor, within the police approved network of problem roads. A list of guilty "speeders" registration numbers was sent to the Police. The owner of the said vehicle would then be sent a letter, warning them of their offence. If the owner received three or more letters relating to the same stretch of road, then the next time the CSW team monitor the same road they would be accompanied by a police officer.

Proposed Reinstatement.

Having had a brief conversation with PC Kyle Lloyd of the Police Speeding team on Tuesday night and subacute emails conversations the police are fully supportive of the re-introduction of CSW in and around the town, on roads that are approved by them.

The next steps if MTC (via P & E) give approval.

- 1. Inform the public about the scheme
- 2. Seek volunteers including councillors.
- 3. Arrange the Police training and obtain the equipment.
- 4. I am happy be administer the scheme, but NOT volunteer to be part of the monitoring team.

Financial Costs.

I believe there is no costs to MTC, as the equipment and training is provided by Wiltshire Police.

<u>Proposal</u>. I would like to propose: -That this committee (P&E) propose to full council that Malmesbury re-state the CSW in Malmesbury having fulfilled to Polices criteria
