'Print and Stitch'

Josephine Wright is a Printmaking Artist who likes experimenting with different printmaking techniques including linocut, etching and screen printing. She is a local artist who has her own printing press, and all her work is individually hand coloured and hand printed in her home studio making each piece unique. She works from sketches and her own photographs to produce an eclectic mix of limited-edition prints.

Gill Hilleard is a mixed media artist who uses the medium of print and stitch where her images are handprinted onto natural fabrics. She takes her inspiration from nature, in particular the imperfections in leaves embellishing them with hand or machine stitching and occasionally beadwork. The beadwork is predominately placed in sections where the leaf has started to decay enhancing the beauty of a natural form.
